We use English as the medium of instruction in all subject except Chinese Language, Chinese History and Chinese Literature (Putonghua is used for these subjects for S1-S3 and Cantonese for S4-S6). Community Service

We nurture students to become informed and caring contributors to our local and global society, and provide opportunities for them to serve the community with care and compassion. We plan for our S4 students to join service trips to developing countries to give back, which fosters their sense of responsibility and agency as global citizens, raises their awareness of the world around them, and teaches them to appreciate and cherish their own circumstances.







Student Leadership

We believe students learn from being part of a team, working collaboratively and taking responsibility. Our student development programme gives students many opportunities to play an active role in the school and to lead others. All students are eligible to take part in our leadership teams, which include the House Committees, Prefect Team, Peer Counsellor Team and Sports Teams.







Career and Life Planning

From S1 to S6, much work is done to prepare students for life beyond school, with informative subject counselling, exploration of career paths and exposure to tertiary institutions. We aim to give all students a life-long love of learning, a deep sense of self-worth and a desire to make a difference as responsible global citizens.









Music

As an integral part of life, our students are given opportunities to refine their techniques and build confidence in music through various learning experiences organised by the College. Within the curriculum there are always aspects of listening, creating and performing. Besides our flourishing Choir and Orchestra, there are great subsidies for students to engage in lessons for a number of different instruments throughout their years with us. Students can also celebrate their successes throughthe regular performances in our assemblies, festivals and special events.







Sports

We believe in providing opportunities for every member of our community to embrace a healthy lifestyle. This has been the foundation of our exceptional growth and success, allowing us to achieve many milestones in our relatively short history, including outstanding performances in many inter-school sports competitions and actively engaging in organizing sporting events for the community. In this manner we promote an atmosphere that encourages sports for all, with the sporting accolades we attain being a welcome byproduct of this environment.

GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES



Outside of the restrictions brought on by the pandemic, we have a long history of planned form-based learning experiences and international trips, for students to explore their cultural identity as well as other Asian cultures and how they interact. We also collaborate with the China Exploration & Research Society (CERS) to provide hands-on experience in nature conservation, wildlife research and cultural heritage preservation at home and abroad. Such experiential learning opportunities bring values, attitudes, knowledge and skills to life, as students"conserve nature and culture, in a sensitive and equitable manner."

Currently we also conduct school visits and exchanges with schools in Shanghai, Beijing, Singapore and Japan. These are conducted online, but they enable us to learn new practices and celebrate commonalities while embracing diversity.

One of our most recent innovative initiatives, Adventure-based Life Education (ABLE) engages students with the natural and cultural world around them. We nurture life skills, resilience, confidence, independence and perseverance through authentic experiences and field work. We have started to achieve this largely through our highly successful Reimagine Interact Create Explore (RICE) and Forest Academy Cyclic Tasks (FACT) year-level experiential programmes in S1 and S2, but are consistently expanding our scope of activities.

All of the above broaden students' horizons, enrich school life, and highlight the student agency possibilities for both the local and global stages.

RECENT INITIATIVES



STEM Education

We place increasing emphasis on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) education by providing real-life situations to help students learn how to analyse real-world issues and think outside the box to explore and solve them.







Sister Schools

By reaching out to sister schools in the Mainland and Singapore, HKUGA College maximizes the opportunities diversity brings. There are now multiple sister schools, namely, Beijing Academy, Shanghai Tianjiabing High School, Yinzhou Tongji High School and Foshan No.10 Middle School. We are also collaborating and conducting cross-country projects with a school in Singapore (Dunman High School) which involves cultural, academic, and leadership sharing. One highlight is a collaborative student project that links our students with those from other countries working in small groups, and guided by teachers, to make a difference on an agreed world issue.

Philosophical Inquiry

We introduced Philosophical Inquiry (PI) to nurture students to become more caring, creative, collaborative and critical thinkers, while developing their capacity to express their views clearly, as well as building a sense of individual and community responsibility for their opinions and actions. Through PI, students also become more attentive to each other, more skilled at cooperating and negotiating, and more reflective about their ways of thinking.





Hybrid Learning

As a constantly adapting organisation, we have gained from our learning throughout the school suspensions and our online classes. We adapted and adopted our strengths from this experience to infuse the use of technology, heightening student engagement, formatively assess learning and providing instantaneous feedback more effectively to benefit a larger number of learners. This results in more students gaining ownership of the processes involved in self-directed learning, and reflecting in meaningful ways to add value to their school experience.

Positive Education

Positive Education defines our current stage of the school's cultural development. We endeavour to provide opportunities for all members of our learning community to learn about and share the principles of Positive Education, embed them into our policies and practices, and apply them to our daily lives, with the ultimate goal of creating an environment where students, teachers, parents, and the wider HKUGA College Community flourish - "feeling good, doing good and looking for the good".

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

University Admissions

Within a decade, the school has developed a strong record of university placements. Each year, our College graduates accept a wide variety of placements from well-known oversea and local universities and institutions.

For the graduates of 2021, while 83% were admitted to bachelor or master's degree programs, 14% were admitted to associate degrees, higher diplomas or foundation programs. In terms of location preference, 77% of them decided to continue their studies in Hong Kong whereas 10% chose to study in the United Kingdom. For the remaining, they pursued their studies in Australia, Canada, Taiwan and Germany.
